Some of these parts are only available from dealerships and can be very expensive. Historically, "junkyards" could be pretty sketchy. Not necessarily so anymore. Locally, we used to have Crazy Ray's. If you ever had the "pleasure" of visiting one of their facilities, they were pretty "Crazy". Enough said. Recently, Michael Taylor and I were tapped to repair his sisters' taillight and rear wiper on her 2007 Jeep Grand Cherokee. Parts were only available at the dealership and were going to cost more than \$200. Ouch!

I checked and Crazy Rays has been purchased by a national chain Pick Your Parts (PYP). We went to the Edgewood location and were pleasantly surprised at the operation. Pay \$3 and walk in with your tools. The cars are all arranged by type: sedans, small SUVs, large SUVs, trucks, etc. You can even look up the car you want on your phone and get the aisle location. The vehicles were all safely set on jack stands made of rims. We Pick your part, return to the office and pay a reasonable price with 30day money back guarantee. The folks there were helpful and courteous. They have locations in Baltimore, Edgewood, Hawkins Point and Mt Airy. We found 3 Cherokees with taillights intact. Pulled one, grabbed a few other small items and checked out. \$40.00. Not bad.
