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For April, Phil Hack is Pinch-hitting for Gary Wilmer

Did you know your antique car's electrical system may not be protected and could be at risk of a catastrophic fire? Many cars prior to the '60's had few fuses for the electrical accessories and many had no protection at all for the whole system. A "Hot" wire went from the battery right to the ignition switch with no protection against overloads or short circuits.

Any accessory fuses were downstream. A short in the unprotected wiring will result in a meltdown and possible fire. To protect against this, manufacturers installed fusible links in the circuit. They are basically a short piece of wire that acts very similarly to a fuse. This wire is 4 gauges smaller than the wire it is protecting.

A 10 AWG wire requires a 14 AWG fusible link. Under heavy overload or short circuit conditions, the link melts open first, breaking the circuit before the main wiring is damaged. Some automotive components require momentary high peak currents or inrush. A fuse may blow under these conditions making them unsuitable for the application. If your antique car does not have this protection, I highly recommend installing a fusible link near the battery. They are inconspicuous and can even be easily removed if you're concerned about authenticity during judging. I'll be talking more about this at the next general meeting. PAGE 11
