But 'Ruby' begged to differ and would point out the many differences. Gary usually 'flipped' his cars quickly, but not so with the Aero Coupe; he kept it around for a little over a year before selling it.

President, John Frank was shuttling people back and forth to the Museum to see all the equipment, tools and machines that were used on this and many other farms in the past 100 or more years. There was an adjacent farm that was also purchased by Howard County and this addition gave the Living Farm Heritage Museum 400 acres of land to utilize.



Chesapeake Region Antique Automobile Club of America, Monthly Membership meeting minutes, May 9, 2022

The monthly membership meeting of the Chesapeake Region of the AACA, (Club or CRAACA), was held on May 9, 2022, at the Divinity Lutheran Church in Towson, MD. There were 27 members in attendance.

Welcome: President Tom Dawson - President Tom Dawson called the meeting to order at 7:05 P.M. and welcomed all in attendance, including several members we haven't seen in a while. Tom also announced that Gary Wilmer has stepped down as Director at Large in order to run for the position of Technical Director. Tom Young, if elected, has agreed to assume the position of Director at Large in order to fill that vacant position. The election will be held as part of this meeting.



Secretary's Report: Al Zimmermann - Al read the minutes from the April 25th Board Meeting. A motion to approve the report was made by Jack Treadwell, seconded by Mark Ster-schic, and passed.

Treasurer's Report: Jack Treadwell - Jack gave his detailed monthly report on Club finances. He also said that an audit of our finances was conducted.

There were a few insignificant arithmetic errors. Bank deposits and debits were also checked, and the overall audit resulted in a clean bill of health. A motion to approve the report and compensate the auditor in the amount of \$200.00 was made by Paula Ruby and seconded by Al Zimmermann. The motion passed and the current monthly report will be held for audit.

Vice President's Report: Nick Prevas - No Report

Membership/Facebook Report: Vicky Wilmer - Vicky reported that we currently have a total of 359 members and that the roster has been updated and paper copies are now available. She added that there have been no recent actions taken on Facebook other than a flyer for the V8 Club Show.

Activities Report: Phil Hack - Phil gave detailed information on upcoming shows, noting that the monthly Bulletin is a great resource for up-to-date information. It also is good to refer to the www.chesapeakeaaca.org website under Activities/Calendars and/or Activities/Reservation Forms. The National AACA website calendar also provides info on all their scheduled events. Phil also talked about a few upcoming events: June 18th-VCCA Nationals at the Classic Auto Mall in Morgantown; June 24 and 25-GM Carlisle; June 25th-Philadelphia Concours d' Elegance at the Simeone Foundation Auto Museum; July 9th-Fire Museum Show; July 14 and 15-Camaro Nationals at the Classic Auto Mall in Morgantown; October 30th-Halloween Poker Run. Phil is also planning a tech session demonstrating u-joint replacement.

Technical Report: Gary Wilmer - Gary said that Jack Treadwell has submitted an article for the Bulletin. Gary is always looking forward to submissions from the membership. He also described a recent technical puzzler, a high voltage shock he received from a flathead V8 while manually actuating the throttle rod.

Chief Judge's Report: Larry Butcher - Larry mentioned the need for judges for the July Fire Museum Show.

Bulletin Report: Bill Wurzell - Bill said that June has not been particularly busy, but as usual has ideas going forward.

Publicity/Web Site Report: Buzz Diehl - No Report

Historian/Program Report: Chip Miller - Chip did a slide presentation of cars leaving the Fall AACA meet in Hershey last October. It is always interesting to see the older vehicles actually running, since most vehicles in the last seventy years are relatively silent and, being more familiar, attract less attention. Chip will always entertain any ideas and suggestions for presenters and videos that everyone can enjoy.

Social Report: Judy Dawson - No report.

Sunshine Report: Margaret Werneth - Margaret's full report will appear in the bulletin.

Old Business: Members in attendance voted unanimously to elect Gary Wilmer to the position of Technical Director and to elect Tom Young to the position of Director at Large. By-Law changes and amendments will be reviewed and approved at the next Board Meeting. The proposed changes will be published in the Bulletin and submitted to the membership for approval.

New Business: The Board has accepted the Gettysburg Regions request for assistance with the Eastern National Meet in May of 2023. We will assist them by handling trailer parking. We will also present the Cruise-In on Thursday, May 18, 2023, as a CRAACA event and will keep the proceeds. This will require entertainment, some type of raffle or dash plaque, and possibly an ice cream truck. A committee will need to be formed to head this project up.

General Discussion: New name tags are available to be ordered at a cost of \$12.00. Contact Michelle Miller.

A meeting with Vaughn Turner of the Howard County Fairgrounds was attended by Tom Dawson, Tom Young, and Jack Treadwell to propose ways to stabilize swap meet rental expenses by using a multi-year contract. Vaughn Turner will present the Fairgrounds rental committee with our suggestions and request.

A brief discussion was held whether we should consider a swap meet at the Manchester Fire Park. This will be discussed further in the future.

Adjournment: A motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Phil Hack and seconded by Vicky Wilmer. The meeting was adjourned at 8:25 P.M.



Tech Talk...dedicated to Gary Ruby,

Technical Director, Emeritus

Jack Treadwell just finished a restoration on a bright yellow 1969 Chevrolet Camaro. Jack elected to use ceramic coating instead of wax on 40-year-old paint. He went over the car three times with a clay bar to remove all the ground-in contaminants and old wax. Then he applied two coats of ceramic coating by hand.

There are spray on types and liquid types applied with a small applicator. Two coats are recommended, with at least one hour between applications. Very light hand buffing with microfiber towel after it dries. Machine buffing is usually not required. Some literature says finish should last two years on a vehicle that lives inside and is covered. Very hard finish and **VERY** high shine. There are various ceramic products available and all probably work well. The coating Jack used was called Armor Shield.

Side note on clay bars: I had some sort of contaminate or overspray on my 1963 Chevrolet Impala and tried the clay bar system. Amazing results, made the surface slick as glass. Try it.


