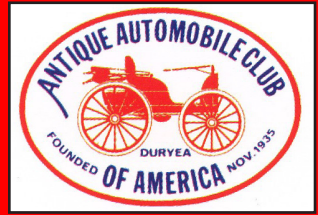

New Chesapeake Region Website Available Soon

Effective January 1, 2023, Chesapeake Region will have a new, replacement website. It will be located at a new internet address: <https://chesapeake.aaca.com> "Please make a note of it."

For a short time after that effective date, visitors to the old website will be directed, with a link, to the new, replacement website at the new internet address. Eventually however, the old website will be deactivated. The new website is operational now, so you can check it out while the current website is still active during December. The upcoming year 2023 Chesapeake Bulletin newsletter editions and our year 2023 event calendars will only be available for reading from the new website.

Chesapeake Region's first website was developed and maintained from 1999 to 2006 by member John Packard. In 2007 it was redeveloped in Microsoft FrontPage software and maintained until 2011 by member Ted Schneider. In 2012 I took over the website operation from Ted and redeveloped it in Microsoft Expression Web software. Microsoft eventually discontinued support for both FrontPage and Expression Web but, as a concession, offered their last version of Expression Web software for free.

Technology has changed considerably over the past decade, and it was time to change our website to accommodate it with improved readability on small handheld devices. Additionally, I wanted to make the maintenance of our website content easier, for both myself and for future club webmasters.

AACA hosts our website for free and, following their recommendation, I have developed the new Chesapeake Region website with widely used WordPress website software, utilizing one of several simpler WordPress "themes" that AACA supports. I believe it will work well for our club.

He also asked if there were any anniversaries or birthdays taking place during this month, so several members shared their information. It was planned so well that there was no cost to the Club.

- Jack gave his detailed monthly report. A motion to approve the report was made by Bill Wurzell and seconded by Tom Young. The motion passed and the current monthly report will be held for audit.

Vice President's Report: Nick Prevas - Nick said that a membership story should be ready for the December Bulletin. Eleanor Packard has returned, and Larry Butcher is submitting a story as well.

Membership/Facebook Report: Vicky Wilmer In Vicky's absence, Michelle Miller reported that we currently have 363 adult and 10 student members, a total of 373 members.

Activities Report: Phil Hack - Phil gave detailed information on upcoming shows, noting that the monthly Bulletin is a great resource for up-to-date information. It also is good to refer to the www.chesapeakeaaca.org website under Activities/Calendars and/or Activities/Reservation Forms. The National AACA website calendar also provides info on all their scheduled events.

Phil talked about the following upcoming events during the meeting: The East Coast Indoor Nationals Car Show will be held at the Timonium Fairgrounds on December 3rd and 4th; the Baltimore Mayor's Parade will be held on December 4th; VCCA Dinner December 11th (VCCA Members contact Stew Chandler by December 4th); Early Ford V8 Club Dinner December 18th (V8 Members contact Al Zimmermann by December 10th). Phil will also be looking into 2023 tours to the garages we visited during the recent Poker Run.

Technical Report: Gary Wilmer - Gary received no calls recently but will have an article in the Bulletin. Chief Judge's Report: Larry Butcher - No report.

Bulletin Report: Bill Wurzell - Bill said the November Bulletin is coming together well.

He also has updated all current flyers and is preparing the PowerPoint presentation for the Christmas Banquet.

Director's Reports: Paula Ruby and Tom Young - Paula said that we will meet at her house to deliver the Club procured bikes, accessories, and any other toys to Hanover for Toys for Tots on December 10th. She explained that these are rewarded by request to families in need.

Tom Young said that we have sold 44 Flea Market spaces so far, and he expects much more activity after the beginning of the year.

Social Report: Judy Dawson - No Report,

Sunshine Report: Margaret Werneth - Margaret's full report will appear in the Bulletin.

Old Business: President Tom said Club Officer election results will be announced at the Banquet. He also reminded the membership that we are to bring chocolate or other candies suitable to fit in a Christmas stocking to the Annual Banquet "For the Love of a Veteran Chocolate Drive" to be coordinated by Elizabeth Bodvin.

The Autumn Harvest Car Show is being scheduled for Sunday, September 24, 2023, in Manchester to avoid conflicts with sporting events adjacent to Fireman's Park on Saturdays.

Paula Ruby made a motion to make an overdue donation of \$200.00 to the Manchester, MD Fire Department in appreciation of the use of their facility for the 2022 Autumn Harvest Car Show. The motion was seconded by Bill Wurzell and passed.

Jack Anderson is heading up the cruise-in during the Eastern National Meet at the Wyndham in Gettysburg on Thursday, May 18, 2023, from 5 pm to 9 pm. It will be open to all car clubs and individuals. Preliminary plans include an ice cream truck, food truck, and possibly a local radio station. A lot of advertising will need to take place. Jack will be looking for CRAACA volunteers to make up committees for Parking, Reception, Audio, Food, etc. Budgeting and consideration of fees has not yet been started.

New Business: N/A

Roundtable Discussion: Paula Ruby made a number of suggestions as follows: The Club needs to design and make available new stationary to update our image; The Club Banner needs to be replaced since it has become tattered and worn; The price of ads placed in the Bulletin should be increased from \$35.00 to \$45.00 to offset increased costs; We should sell more ads for the Bulletin as well. These suggestions will be addressed at the next board meeting in January.

After a discussion, the consensus was that we should look into whether we can use the church for Saturday daytime general meetings during the 2023 winter months on January 14th, February 11th, and March 4th. 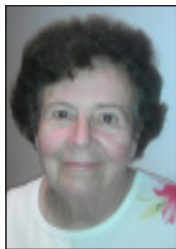

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••••• Tech Talk...dedicated to Gary Ruby, Technical Director, Emeritus

With winter approaching and getting close to putting our old cars away, I will give my 50 years' experience on how I store my vehicles for the next 3 or 4 months. I'm sure that we all have heard different procedures that collectors swear by, and you may not agree with me, but I have never had an issue with winter storage when it's time to get the old cars out in the spring.

There are many more steps you can take (put car on jack stands, drain fluids, wax entire car, etc.) but if you have multiple cars, it can just be too much. I try to keep it simple and easy.

First, fill the gas tank and add Stabil to fuel. Second, keep a maintainer on each cars' battery. Yes, some people worry about a fire, but I still do it. Third, change oil if you feel its needed. I usually change oil once a year even if mileage is very low. Fourth, hang a bag of Damp Rid inside the vehicle to eliminate moisture and mold. Also, moth balls and/or rodent repellent if necessary.

Finally, once the first snow falls and road salt is spread, I put the cars away, under a car cover, and I don't start them until spring. I know some guys say start the engine every couple of weeks and let them idle for at least 20 minutes or more. I have not done this and have not had any issues.

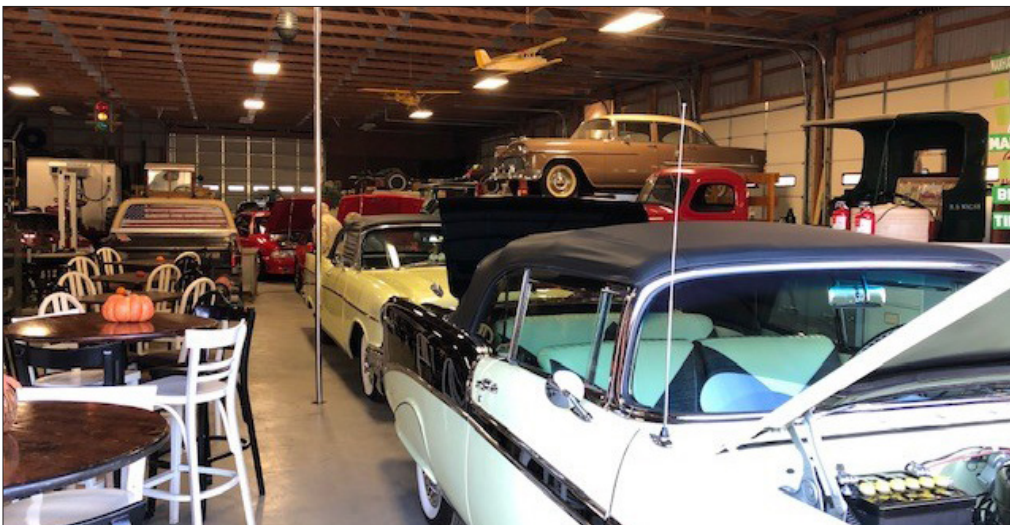
Yes, some collectors do a lot more but these procedures, especially when you have multiple cars, will work just fine.

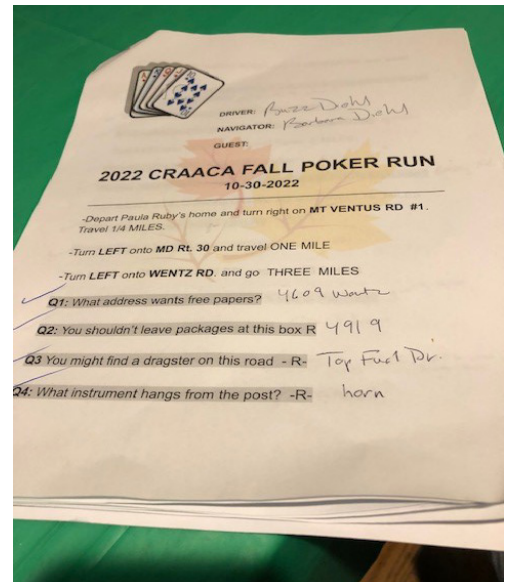

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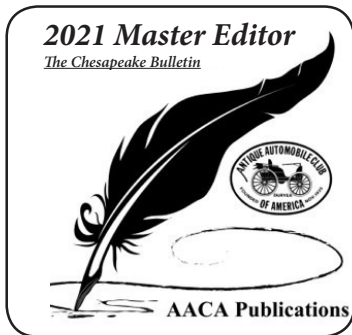
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
