

Toyota: Quality Problem or Cheap Dealership?

November 21 st of 2023, I bought a used 2023 Toyota Tacoma from Koons Westminster Toyota with only 8706 miles on it. I really only bought it because it had a 6-speed manual transmission that no one else was offering. It had some features that were very good, like the headrests were removable so they could not interfere with the brim of my hat when I was wearing a fedura, and I have the ability to turn off the daytime running lights.

The problem I have is the rear differential will sing when I am on the gas, and be silent when I am backing down. You motor-heads know that this is caused by an incorrect meshing of the ring and pinion gears in the differential. I find this very irritating! When I complained to the Koons dealership, I was told that this was normal. Rob Stoll, the service manager at the Koons dealership, told me that they did not repair differentials, but only replaced them, and a new differential would be likely to have the same problem. Really! Has the quality of Toyotas sunk to that level?

I suspected that this dealership was cheap when I received my license tags in the mail, and I found that my truck had no front tag bracket. When I went back to the dealer to complain, I was told that they did not provide front tag brackets for used vehicles, and I could probably buy one on Ebay. Really! I suspect that the previous owner drove this truck on the hard road in 4-wheel drive. If you do that, the differential will wind up in this condition. 50 years ago, I accidently drove a military jeep in 4-wheel drive for a couple miles, and it ended up just like this. The Koons dealership had a Toyota Field Technician coming to their facility, so they asked me to bring my truck in for his inspection. According to Rob Stoll, after 12 miles, no abnormal problem was observed.

As for Koons Westminster Toyota: If your customer is disappointed with your product, there is a problem!

Two Tech Tips from CRAACA Member- Russell Love

Rough engine: If your car won't start or is running rough, pull the hose off the power brake booster and spray starting fluid or carb cleaner into the hose. The vacuum will pull the fluid into the engine. If the condition improves, you know you have a fuel problem and not an electrical problem.

Fan Belt Noise: If you are hearing a noise coming from your engine and you think it could be the water pump, generator or power steering pump, remove the drive belt and run the engine. If the noise goes away, this will narrow it down to one of these items.




